LOCAL YOUTH GAIN VALUABLE WORK EXPERIENCE THIS SUMMER







Seventeen local youth were celebrated this August for their outstanding efforts in Warren County's Summer Youth Employment Program (SYEP)—a six-week initiative that connects young people to paid work experiences while helping them build essential job and life skills. This year's participants, ages 14–20, worked at a variety of local businesses, nonprofits, and municipalities across the county, including Oscar's Smokehouse, Romeo Toyota, The Georgian Lakeside Resort, and Operation Food Chain, among others. From preparing meals and assisting customers to organizing inventory and supporting office operations, each youth played a valuable role in keeping workplaces running smoothly during the busy summer season.

The celebration, held at Crandall Park in Glens Falls, brought together youth workers, employers, local leaders, and Warren County staff for a well-deserved afternoon of recognition and appreciation. Awards were given for excellence in categories such as teamwork, perseverance, respect, and perfect attendance. Attendees included members of the Warren County Board of Supervisors and Assemblyman Matthew Simpson, whom presented the Employee of the Summer award to **Brianna Dunning of Warrensburg** for her exceptional work at Oscar's Smokehouse. NEW YORK'S MINIMUM WAGE INCREASING TO \$16 AN HOUR

Beginning January 1, 2025, New York State's minimum wage will increase to \$16.00 per hour. This statewide adjustment is part of New York's continued effort to ensure fair pay and help workers keep up with rising living costs. The increase applies to most employees across the state and is part of a multi-year plan to make gradual, predictable wage adjustments. Employers are encouraged to review payroll and update employee wages ahead of the new year to stay in compliance.

This change reflects New York's commitment to supporting working individuals and strengthening the state's economy through fair compensation.
