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Breaking Down Barriers to Employment With Enhanced Transportation Options

Transportation remains a significant barrier to employment for many job seekers. Recent additions in public transportation systems are gradually opening doors to more opportunities for individuals, businesses, and community-based organizations. The merger of Greater Glens Falls Transit (GGFT) with Capital Transportation Authority (CDTA) is bridging previously existing gaps, particularly in the recruitment of bus drivers. Leveraging CDTA's larger workforce and extensive resources, the merger streamlines the process of recruiting and training drivers within the regional service Notably, CDTA has expanded the current route system in Warren County by adding 200 additional stops. This expansion significantly enhances accessibility, enabling riders to reach stops closer to their origin or final destination. Explore the routes and schedule here: https://www.cdta.org/warren

In its fourth season, CDPHP Cycle bikeshare program is gearing up for action with the addition of 35 e-bikes to its fleet. E-bikes facilitate faster travel and make uphill journeys effortless. Set to return to Glens Falls, Queensbury and Lake George in mid-April, the bikeshare racks offer a convenient, eco-friendly mode of transportation.

While traditional pedal bikes remain available, e-bikes offer an extra boost for a nominal fee. Pedal bikes are 8 cents per minute and e-bikes are 15 cents per minute. Monthly passes are available at \$15, with seasonal memberships at \$85. College students benefit from a 50% discount. Opportunities Ahead: Summer Youth Job Initiatives

As the summer season approaches, employers are actively seeking to fill a multitude of available positions. The Warren County Department of Workforce Development has been instrumental in facilitating the recruitment process through various job fairs and work experience programs.

Kicking off the high school job fair season on March 20th, the Queensbury Union Free School District spearheaded efforts to connect students with prospective employers. Denise Lamouree, Career Exploration Educator, arranged insightful session where employers engaged with 8th-grade students. During the middle school job fair, students had the opportunity to interact employers, gaining with insights into the nature of work within different businesses, available tasks suitable for 14 and 15-year-olds, and the hiring procedures for current vacancies.

Twenty businesses at the High School eagerly interacted with hundreds of students motivated to secure employment. Several applications were filled out and submitted on-site, demonstrating the enthusiasm of students. Participating businesses were pleased with the caliber of potential candidates and were impressed by the students' level of engagement. Bear Job Fair at Glens Falls High School on April 11th, as well as a community job fair at Lake George High School on April 17th. Each fair is tailored to specific needs of the district involved. The Glens Falls event will feature industry speakers enlightening students about diverse career opportunities in the area, alongside workshops focusing on essential skills such as teamwork, resilience, and work ethic. The job fair in Lake George, scheduled from 4 to 6 pm, will be open to the general public, allowing employers to connect with students and community seeking employment.

Preparations are underway for this year's Summer Youth Employment Program (SYEP), designed to match youth aged 14-20 with participating worksites across Warren County. This initiative aims to provide meaningful work experience while fostering positive community connections. Youth wages are covered through a federal program, providing participating worksites with additional staff support at no cost during a typically busy period. The program is scheduled to run from July 1st to August 9th, with application packets due by April 30th.
