



Chester Creek Trail

TOWN OF CHESTER, NY



- Difficulty:** Easy; family friendly
- Length:** 0.9 mile loop
- Time to Complete:** 1/2 hr to 1 hr

This short, flat hike winds along Chester Creek and through the surrounding woods and wetlands. Several benches offer a place to sit and admire the view, and interpretive signs along the way offer interesting facts about the local flora and fauna.




Directions and Parking:


Take the Northway to Exit 25. Take Route 8 South for approximately 1.6 mi to U.S. Route 9. Turn left onto Route 9 South. Continue for 0.4 mi and park in the Municipal Center Parking lot on the right. The trailhead is at the end of the parking lot.

Things to Do Nearby:

Chester Creek Trail is located right in the hamlet of Chestertown, on the Municipal Center property. Visit on Wednesdays during the summer to take advantage of the farmer's market, or stop in to visit the Museum of Local History in the Municipal Center. Numerous shops and eateries are located within walking distance of the trail, or check out the buildings in Chestertown's Historic District.
