Kibby Pond Trail

WILCOX LAKE WILD FOREST TOWN OF JOHNSBURG, NY



Difficulty: Easy
Length: 2.6 miles round trip
Elevation Gain: 580'
Time to Complete: 2-3 hours
Trailhead Coordinates: -74 6.33 43 34.67
Markers: Yellow
Trail Notes: This relative easy hike crosses a beautiful brook, then heads up a moderate climb to the shore of pretty Kibby Pond. The trail may be muddy in spots and requires scrambling over a few downed trees, but it is well-marked and easy to follow. One campsite is located right at the trail's end and another can be found just a short distance south.





Directions and Parking:

Take the Northway to Exit 23. Turn west on Diamond Point Rd and then right onto US9 N for 4.2 miles. Turn left onto NY-28N S and continue for 10.7 miles. Turn left onto NY-8 S and continue for 11.5 miles. The trailhead, with a small sign that may be easily missed, is on the left. Parking is along the road.

Things to Do Nearby:

Hike to Cod Pond or Stewart Creek Flow along the Oregon Trail from the nearby Cod Pond trailhead, or camp at one of the many nearby primitive campsites.
