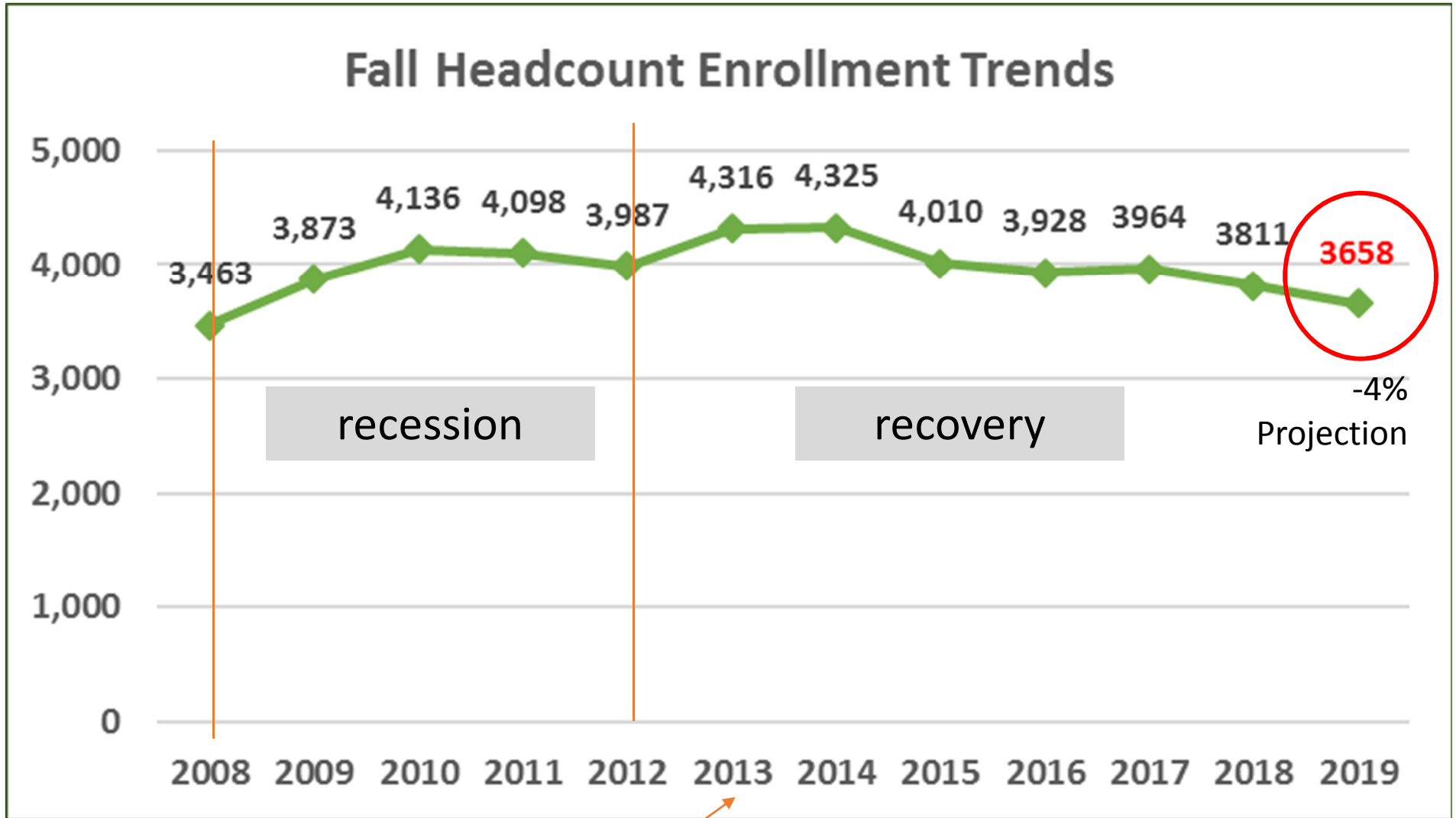

SUNY ADK Enrollment trends



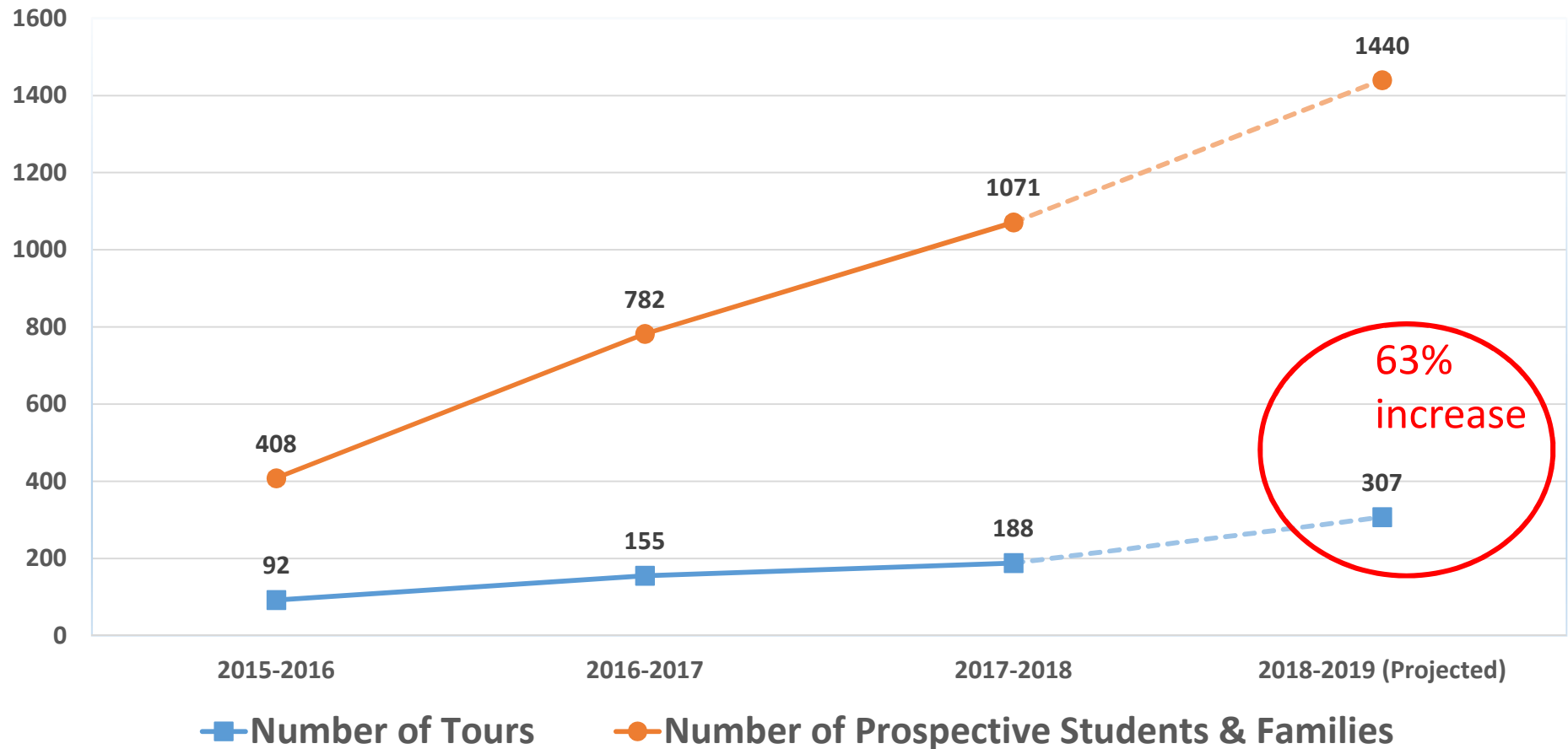
Added housing, expanded Wilton

Enrollment

- Fall 2019- projecting a 6% FTE decline, and 4% fall headcount due to full employment market (largest decline over past 4 years is in students over 25), and college aged population decline
- About even with last year for new students
- Large graduating class for 2018-2019 (despite declining enrollment)
- Rebranding Wilton to SUNY Adirondack Saratoga

- 60% of our graduates leave debt-free
