A Complete Count is Critical!

Census data:

- affects our representation in government
- determines how much federal and state funding our communities receive
- helps inform business decisions, policy and community initiatives

The Census Bureau estimates that Warren County lost population between 2000-2017

We need to make an extra effort to reach populations with historically low response rates and hard-to reach populations

Fall 2019: New Construction Program (Warren County GIS).

Fall 2019: Address Field Verification (Census Bureau using local employees)

September 2019-April 2020: Hiring of enumerators (estimate of 200-250 for Warren County; pay is \$17/hr+mileage; must be 18+; hours 10-40/week)

March 2020: Census postcards sent to most homes

March 12-20 2020: Mailing 1: Letter with info to take survey online (majority of people will get this) or letter+paper survey (20-25% of people based on demographics and internet connectivity)

March 16-24 Mailing 2: Reminder letter to non-respondents

March 26-April 3 Mailing 3: Postcard to non-respondents

April Mailing 4: Letter+questionnaire to non-respondents

April Mailing 5: "It's not too late" postcard to non-respondents

May-July: Enumerators conduct non-response follow-up and collect information at the door

Dec 31, 2020: The census director delivers apportionment counts to the President


March 2021: The Census Bureau completes delivery of redistricting counts to the states

This proposed project at the Black Hole in Johnsburg includes an overall site utilization plan, hiking and biking trail development, and site improvements



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Lake George Water Quality Improvements

In cooperation with the towns of Queensbury, Town and Village of Lake George, Bolton, and Ticonderoga, Warren County will undertake stormwater and wastewater improvements throughout the LG Basin.

Funding Source: LWRP

Total Project Cost: \$653,000

State Cost: \$487,500

Local Match: \$165,500

Source of Match: in-kind and cash



Stormwater Improvements to Mitigate Impacts to East Brook

This portion of the project will involve the installation of stormwater improvements on Beatty Rd and the surrounding area to reduce impacts to East Brook

Town: Lake George

Total Project Cost: \$25,000

State Cost: \$18,104

Local Match: \$6,896 (in-kind)

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Village of Lake George Stormwater Improvements

Design of improvements to box culvert under Dieskau St to eliminate risk of failure to the overlying roadway and structure and reduce the amount of sediment entering LG from Sheriff's Brook.

Design and construction of stormwater improvements in the Skylar Heights neighborhood.

Rockhurst Community Sewer System Design

Final engineering design for the proposed Rockhurst Community Sewer System

Town: Queensbury

Total Project Cost: \$75,000

State Cost: \$54,313

Local Match: \$20,687 (cash)

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Bolton Sewer Pump Station Enhancements

Installation of networked communication system on pump stations along shoreline.

Design and installation of supplemental backup systems to the Main Pump Station, which is 35 feet from the shoreline of Lake George.

Total Project Cost: \$230,000

State Cost: \$166,558

Local Match: \$63,442 (cash and in-kind)



Ticonderoga Roadside Stormwater and Erosion Controls

Installation of erosion control measures and stormwater infiltration on Baldwin and Black Point Roads.

Town: Ticonderoga

Total Project Cost: \$50,000

State Cost: \$36,208

Local Match: \$13,792 (cash and in-kind)




Warren County Roadside Stormwater and Erosion Controls

Installation of erosion control measures and stormwater infiltration on County roads in the Lake George Watershed

Total Project Cost: \$60,000

State Cost: \$43,450

Pottersville Public Water Infrastructure Enhancements

The Town of Chester is seeking funding to upgrade the aging municipal drinking water system in the Hamlet of Pottersville. The County will assist the Town with preparing a Town application.


Funding Source: CDBG

Total Project Cost: \$750,000

Local Match: \$0

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North Creek Sewer Engineering

As a follow-up to a previously funded engineering map and plan report, the County will submit an application to Department of State for the preparation of design and construction drawings for the North Creek sewer district. This activity will also support the BUILD application being prepared by DPW.

Funding Source: LWRP

Total Project Cost: \$400,000

Local Match: \$100,000 (Johnsburg)







Warren County Housing Needs Study

The County will submit an application to undertake a housing needs analysis for the communities within Warren County. It is expected this study will complement and incorporate needs identified in the Town of Queensbury Housing Study and a study done for the City of Glens Falls housing project.

Funding Source: CDBG Planning

Project Cost: \$50,000

Local Match: \$30,000 from LDC and EDC (match not required

but encouraged)







Climate Smart Communities Certification Actions

The Planning Department, Soil and Water, and LGLC Regional Planning Board will apply for grant funding to complete a comprehensive Natural Resource Inventory, Climate Vulnerability Assessment and Adaptation Strategy, Climate Resiliency Plan, Fleet Inventory, and Heat Emergency Plan, utilizing existing staff resource.

Total Project Amount: \$100,000

State Cost: \$50,000

Local Match: \$50,000 (staff time)
